Topics covered

We prepared **your child for Primary 3** by **introducing them to more advanced grammar topics** such as infinitives and modals, the rule of proximity and phrasal verbs.



Skills learnt

Using **five-senses description** and **show-not-tell help** a writer to **paint a vivid picture** of their experiences for the reader. Through writing a journal about deep sea exploration, your child had the chance to practise these literary techniques and hone their writing skills.



Highlights

We continued to **build your child's vocabulary** and taught him or her how to use food-related idioms to **make their writing come to life!**



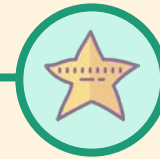
Topics covered

Composition Writing accounts for 20% of the total marks for the PSLE English paper. Through a side-by-side comparison with the format that your child has seen in Primary 2, we will **introduce your child to the format of the PSLE composition**. We will **guide your child through the steps needed to give him or her the added boost of confidence** to tackle this component.



Skills learnt

Sourcing for clues and **analysing questions** are two important foundational skills that will help your child tackle the comprehension component. We will teach your child how to utilise our in-house framework to hone these skills.



Highlights

Narrative stories are brought to life with compelling characters. We will teach your child how to **use simple writing techniques to craft realistic descriptions of characters** to enhance their stories.

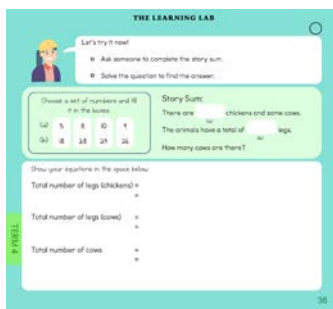
Term 4 Snapshots

Topic(s) covered

- **Early headstart to next year's curriculum** - selected **new Primary 3 topics** were introduced during the school holiday period. (Multiplication, Money, Graphs, Managing Word Problems)
- **Games and activities** were incorporated to make **new topics more relatable**. Your child used play money to explore **division of larger numbers** and discussed about Singapore food imports using **data from bar graphs**.

Skill(s) learnt

- **Strengthening problem analysis skills** - Your child learnt to **compare word problems** with similar phrasing through **identifying keywords**. Mastering this skill will allow your child to apply the correct method to solve the word problems.
- **Term 4 concept kit activities** helped to reinforce your child's learning of these word problems.



Highlights

- **Applied learning** – Your child saw how **length was applied to real-life** by exploring the world's top 5 longest train journeys through the 'The Rail Story' activity.



- Your child **revisited concepts** through **topical revisions, a story-based booklet and the concept kit activities**.



Primary 3 Mathematics

Term 1 What to expect

Topic(s) covered

- **What to expect for P3 curriculum** – On top of learning new topics Geometry and Area & Perimeter, your child will expand their knowledge of Primary 2 topics, dealing with bigger numbers and more complex word problems.
- **Laying a strong foundation** – We will build on the **fundamentals for Numbers to 10 000, Addition & Subtraction, Money and Multiplication & Division** to prepare your child for the arithmetic skills needed for word problems.

Skill(s) learnt

- **Exposure to new word problems types** - Your child will further develop their existing Primary 2 knowledge, tackling more complex concepts. Your child will **apply model drawing** to solve word problems involving transfers and comparisons up to three quantities
- **GEP Preparation** - With our series of **GEP modules** across terms to prepare for the selection test, your child will be exposed to questions that develop their reasoning and higher-order thinking skills.



Highlights

- **Starting the new level with a story**- Using an interesting storyline, your child will be introduced to new topics in Primary 3 (Bar Graphs, Parallel and Perpendicular Lines, and Area and Perimeter) while exploring some cities through a simulated class trip!
- **Exposure to real – world applications** – Using a colourful infographic, your child will learn about different currencies and the value of money.
